PRINCIPLES OF LAW, PUBLIC SAFETY, CORRECTIONS AND SECURITIES

 Prerequisite: None

Students will gain knowledge of professions in law enforcement, protective services, corrections, firefighting, and emergency management services. Students will examine the roles and responsibilities of police, courts, corrections, private security, and protective agencies of fire and emergency services.

LAW ENFORCEMENT I

 Prerequisite: None

Students will develop an introductory knowledge of the history, organization, and functions of local, state, and federal law enforcement. Students will understand the role of constitutional law at local, state, and federal levels; the U.S. legal system; criminal law; and law enforcement terminology and the classification and elements of crime.

FEDERAL LAW & PROTECTIVE SERVICES

Students will gain knowledge of security elements and types of organizations with a focus on security measures used to protect lives, property, and proprietary information, to ensure computer security, to provide information assurance, and to prevent cybercrime.

LAW ENFORCEMENT II

 Grades: 11-12 1.0 Credit
 Prerequisite: Law Enforcement I

Students will gain knowledge and skills necessary to prepare for a career in law enforcement. Students will understand ethical and legal responsibilities, patrol procedures, first responder roles, telecommunications, emergency equipment operations, and courtroom testimony.

CORRECTIONAL SERVICES

 Grades: 11-12 1.0 Credit
 Prerequisite: Law Enforcement I

Students will gain knowledge and skills necessary to prepare for a career as a municipal, county, state, or federal correctional officer. Students will learn the role and responsibilities of a county or municipal correctional officer; discuss relevant rules, regulations, and laws of municipal, county, state, or federal facilities; and discuss defensive tactics, restraint techniques, and first aid procedures as used in the municipal, county, state, or federal correctional setting. Students will analyze rehabilitation and alternatives to institutionalization for inmates.
