APPLICATION PROCESS

- Students, with the assistance of their parent or guardian, will complete the application linked on the pathways website.
- Students meeting enrollment criteria may be entered into a "lottery" selection process.
- Students will be interviewed by a district/campus team.
- Selection will occur prior to the end of the school year and notification will be sent by email.


